Phonics	<p>Today in phonics, do a warm up by looking at the Power Point that we use in school to go through the phonics sounds (only go to slide 56 as this is where the children have learnt up to so far). This week, you have been learning about the sound 'ue'. Get a piece of paper and see if you can write down these words that your adult will read to you: blue, true, glue, argue, Sue. Add sound buttons if you can. English	<p>Today, we are looking again at our book 'Almost Anything' by Sophy Henn. Please listen to the story again here https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=aX-o6tkCPrM There is lots of talking between the characters (for example between George and Bear) "George, come over here. I have something for you..." Said Bear "For me?" asked George. Lots of the animals talk to George to try to encourage him to do more things. You are more likely to persuade someone to do something if you give them a good reason. What is your favourite thing to do that you think George might like to join in with? Can you think of what you might say to George to persuade him to try something new with you? Go to the activity sheet to see today's activity.</p>

Maths	Today in Maths, we will be looking at doubling. Please have a look at the 'doubling Power Point' first. I have recorded myself speaking over the Power Point, so when you click 'view slideshow', you don't need to click any buttons, just let it play like a video. Then, have a look at the activity sheet. There are some questions for you to answer and then a game to play at the end if you feel confident enough.
Art	Today in art, you are going to be learning about weaving. Please have a look at the Power Point on weaving. It tells you everything you need to know and what resources you will need to make your own. You don't need to use fancy paper, you can make this with plain paper and then colour parts of it in to make it look beautiful! Just try your best and use your funky fingers to have a good go.
