Then from Monday to Wednesday, both this week and next, we will have a task linked to the book. Today's English task focuses on descriptive writing. We want you to think back to the underwater pictures in middle of the story and look really closely at what is there. Then we would like you to describe the scene. Think about what you can see; hear; smell; feel; taste. You can choose which task sheet you would prefer to complete as there is a different picture to describe on each. There are two word mats which you could use to pick some words from. One to help you with adjectives to describe things and one to help you with conjunctions to make your sentences longer.
